Nestled in the Bernese Oberland in southwest Switzerland, the magnificent Gstaad Palace is a fairytale escape that retains its old world glamour, whilst offering contemporary comforts and unparalleled service.

Although the Palace celebrates its 104th birthday this year, its seasonal opening allows for a continued loving refresh and refurbishment of the rooms and public areas each year in partnership with interior designer Marina Nickels; no room is more than 4 years old.

Gstaad holds an irresistible fascination in all seasons, offering over 220km of ski slopes, a wide variety of outdoor activities in both winter and summer, as well as renowned music festivals, gourmet and sporting events.

Gstaad Palace offers a blend of culinary options and

gastronomic tradition across its 5 restaurants from gourmet grills to Swiss, Italian and International cuisine, and GreenGo nightclub is the place to spend the evening partying in style.

The Palace Spa – with breathtaking mountain views – is spread over a staggering 1,800 sq.m, including eight treatment rooms, a relaxation lounge centred around an open fireplace, a unique Hammam experience, private spa suite, saunas and steam baths, indoor and outdoor pools and Jacuzzi.

Separate to the hotel, located above the nearby village of Gsteig at 1,700 meters, The Walig Hut offers a charming hideaway with breathtaking views of Gstaad and the Saanenland; perfect for romantic or family stays or for a celebratory lunch or private dinners.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Gstaad Palace opened its doors in 1913 and has been run by three generations of the Scherz family. It has survived turbulent times of the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Wall Street Crash of 1929.

The Executive Chef at Gstaad Palace, Franz W. Faeh, is a gastronomic talent who has been closely associated with the Palace for decades. Raised in Gstaad, Faeh completed his apprenticeship at the Palace itself before heading to Asia to develop his signature flair and where he regularly cooked for the Thai Royal Family. He has since felt the pull of his homeland and has brought his cuisine's lightness and subtlety to develop a modern interpretation of Palace classics that remain true to the spirit of this institution whilst keeping dishes innovative for loyal guests and newcomers alike.

Specially created for the Gstaad Palace Spa, the Hammam ritual offers seven harmonious stages over 130 sq.m and has been designed for couples or individual use.

The Spa includes products by Sisley, Gemology, Jardin de

Monts and Ivo Pitanguy

To enhance a mountain feeling to the spa, an impressive 60 metre long granite wall using 50 tons of rock from the Blausee region was cut and painstakingly constructed.

One of Switzerland's major sporting events, the Swiss Open Gstaad, first took place at the tennis courts of Gstaad Palace in 1968.

Between June and September, Gstaad hosts an unrivalled selection of world class events and activities, including the Menuhin Music Festival, the Hublot Polo Gold Cup, the Beach Volleyball World Tour and the Palace's own Tennis Weeks.

Gstaad Palace's refurbished Walig Hut, built in 1786 and orignally used by farmers when bringing their cows to pasture, is nestled 5000 ft high within the Swiss Alps, accessed by hiking or horse drawn carriage. It accommodates up to 80 for lunch, 14 for dinner and 2 adults and 2 children for an overnight stay.
